Welcome to our first newsletter of 2023!

I would firstly like to congratulate the Class of '23 on their GCSE results. They worked incredibly hard to get their very well deserved results and we look forward to hearing about the achievements of our latest alumni.

So much has happened this half term. This week, all of our students from Years 8-10 who had met our expectations in behaviour and attendance last academic year were invited to either Drayton Manor or Alton Towers. Almost 500 children had a great time at the theme parks this week. On 11th October, a group of students from Year 9 went to visit the Tower of London as part of their enriched History curriculum. They loved seeing the sights and experiencing the buzz of our capital city. All students on trips have been a credit to the Academy and their community whilst there, we could not be prouder of them.

Quality of Education:

As you are aware, we introduced Satchel One, our new self-study at the start of this academic year. This has been a huge success so far and as the you can see from the figures below the huge majority of students are completing the tasks set on time each week. Therefore, a massive well done to all students who have completed this at home or at our Self-study club afterschool on a Wednesday or Friday. Completion rates so far this year -

Year 7 – 97% Year 8 – 90% Year 9 – 85% Year 10 - 90%

Year 11 - 93%

It is important that <u>all</u> students are accessing these tasks, so they can also benefit from the following advantages of completing self-study-

- 1. It helps students to remember what they have been taught.
- 2. Develops the practice of independent learning.
- 3. Promotes students' self-discipline.
- 4. Supports with the retention of factual knowledge and increased understanding.
- 5. Is valuable in ensuring students' progress and raising achievement.

To support your child, here are some ways you can help:

- Create your Satchel One parent account using the code previously shared, if you haven't done so, to keep track of how your child is doing.
- Make sure your child has downloaded the Satchel One app or completes the tasks at home using a different device or attends self-study club afterschool to complete it then, if they cannot access this at home.
- Make it clear to your child that you value homework.
- Encourage your child and praise them when they have completed homework.
- Expect deadlines to be met and check that they are.
- To support your child with organisation and time management.

Behaviour:

The role of our Academy goes beyond simply preventing poor behaviour and maintaining good order to systematically promoting positive relationships and good manners. We expect that all of our students demonstrate consistently exceptional attitudes to learning, exemplary conduct both in and outside the Academy and a love for learning.

This work involves a clear partnership between Parents/Carers, students and the Academy in helping our young people become active global citizens, able to make a full contribution to society and so live a happy and successful life.

Rewards

Well done to the 1013 of our students in the Academy that have received only one, or no C2's this first half term. A fantastic achievement, we are so proud of you! We will soon be sharing details of our celebration evening which will be occurring in Half term 2. We are excited to celebrate lots of our students and their achievements.

Uniform - NBA Hoodies

Noel-Baker Hoodies are now able to be worn as part of the Academy uniform, due to the cooler weather. Please note that NBA hoodies are an addition to uniform and do not replace the blazer. <u>The blazer must be worn over</u> the hooded top at all times. <u>The NBA hoodie can be worn without the blazer on PE days</u>.

Uniform - Jewellery, eyelashes and nails

Please remember that the following must not be worn in school;

Nails (natural or false) that are longer than 0.5cm past the end of the finger. More than 1 earring per ear. Facial piercings, or piercings that are not situated in the ear lobe. Necklaces. Bracelets. More than 1 ring. False eyelashes of any kind. Lanyards must also be worn at all times throughout the academy day.

The expectation is that, should a student arrive at school wearing any of the above, they will be asked to remove them. Should the student refuse, parents/ carers will be requested to support in their removal. Students will not attend lessons until uniform issues have been rectified

C2 - Persistent refusal to follow instructions, absconding.

A C2 is issued, when a student has not made the right choice and has not rectified their behaviour following a C1.

If issued a C2, the student must remain in their lesson and wait for a member of the on-call team to collect them.

The student must follow instructions and enter the checking room/ behaviour room in a calm and orderly manner.

Students must remain in the behaviour room at all times, unless instructed otherwise.



Behaviour continued...


To minimise the amount of lesson time missed and reduce gaps in learning, time spent in the behaviour room following a C2 has been reduced. Students now complete a shorter session where, if successful, they return to lessons. The expectation is that **all students that receive a C2 attend detention from 3.05-4.00pm**, where a corrective conversation with their member of staff will take place.

It is imperative that all students follow these instructions to ensure that they can be kept safe in the academy.

- If a student does not follow these instructions or absconds at any point, they will remain isolated for the full day.
- If a student receives 2 C2's in one day, they will remain isolated for the full day.
- If a student fails their corrective conversation with the member of staff, they will remain isolated until successful.
- If a student doesn't attend detention, they will be isolated the following day and complete their detention then.

Improving attendance is everyone's business and we all need to be obsessed with it because the rewards are great! Attending school punctually every day is directly linked to improved exam performance which should in turn lead to further learning opportunities and better job prospects. As well as this, going to school helps to develop friendships, social skills, team values, life skills, cultural awareness and career pathways. Every day matters because days off have a negative impact on learning- even having 3 days off so far since September means that your child is nearly a Persistent Absentee (around 90% attendance).
