

Noel-Baker Academy Student Leadership Strategy 2019-2020

Rationale

At Noel-Baker leadership is about motivating, inspiring and directing people so that they work together to achieve a common goal. Students will have the opportunity to share with a selection panel their vision for our school and what they can do to ensure that vision is realised.

Mechanisms

LEAD - All student leaders have a duty to model the highest standards of appearance and behaviour. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Wearing full school uniform correctly at all times.
- Using and promoting the Academy principles of SHAPE, STEPS, SLANT and PRESENT.
- Receiving no negative behaviour points.
- Actively engaging with the school's co-curricular programme.
- Lead and manage a school council so that students' opinions can be shared with the academy's leadership team.

EMPOWER – In order to empower the student body student leaders wills:

- Lead and manage a school council so that students' opinions can be shared with the academy's leadership team.
- Attend and take an active part in school events including open evenings.
- Be responsible for planning, promoting and running charity events.
- Working with our feeder Primary schools to help the transition process.

ACHIEVE – Student leaders will be expected to work hard and make good progress in their academic studies. They will be expected to model a good work ethic which will include, but is not limited to:

- Arriving at all lessons and meetings on time
- Exhibiting high standards of Literacy.
- Producing work of a high standard in all lessons.
- Meeting all homework and coursework deadlines.
- Becoming mature global citizens and working with the wider community.

DRIVE – Students will help drive the school's success by:

- Encouraging all students to follow the academy expectations
- Challenging students' lack of respect for the school and its core principles in an appropriate manner
- Drive forward high standards and work in partnership with all stakeholders
