

# Bespoke Intervention for latecomers

All 'latecomers' will be given a warm welcome so they are not deterred from coming in due to an uncomfortable entry and start to the day.

If pupils arrive to school after 8:30am they will line up outside the main school reception area where they will be greeted with a warm and caring welcome by Mrs Pedlar (Assistant Headteacher) and one of the Education Welfare Officers (Miss Mills or Miss Heath). Pupils will have their uniform checked to ensure that they are ready to access the learning that they are entitled to.

Pupils will be issued with a 'late' detention card which identifies where the detention will take place after school (3:00pm- 4:00pm in A21). They will then be taken to their 'LEADers are READers' first session of the day by the Education Welfare Officers or Heads of House. Pupils will receive a late ('L') code on their Go4Schools attendance register.

A text message will be sent to parents to inform them that their son/daughter will be attending a one-hour detention that day. Pupils will not be collected to attend so it is their responsibility to make their own way to the detention room (A21) after their last lesson of the day. Our attendance policy states that pupils who fail to attend their detention will be placed in the behaviour room for the whole of the following day. Parents/Carers will then be notified.

During the 'late' after school detention pupils will be taught a one-hour lesson by a specialist teacher in subjects including Geography, English Language, English Literature, Maths and Science.

Good habits are developed from an early age. It is vital that punctuality is the norm rather than the exception. We will always support pupils to encourage and demonstrate the importance of efficient timekeeping which will lead them to a bright future.
