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Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of what has been a long and challenging year for us all I would like to take this opportunity to write to you to outline the arrangements for the end of the summer term, some changes to our procedures in the autumn and the details of our return in September.

I would like to thank all parents and carers for your ongoing and unswerving support of the academy and our young people as we have worked hard to manage and navigate our way through the last year and the many challenges that gradually returning to normal post cv-19 have thrown up.

I am very proud of the staff and students of Noel-Baker Academy, despite the difficulties that have come our way during the course of this year the Academy has continued to improve and we are delighted that the academy is now publicly recognised by Ofsted as a Good school. I am thankful of your support in helping us to achieve so much and I have been very pleased to hear from many of you about how different you and your children feel the Academy is.

In September, we will continue with our relentless focus on driving up standards and the quality of education in the Academy. Research shows that schools that have the highest standards and expectations of all students are those who achieve the very best results. With that in mind, and in order to continue on our rapidly improving journey we will continue to focus on ensuring that all students meet our expectations, including being fully equipped and correctly dressed for school and attaining a 100% attendance record.

With that in mind, please find below details of the arrangements for the end of term and the start of the new term in September 2021.

End of term arrangements

The academy will close for the summer holidays on Friday 22nd July at 12:05. Students will be able to purchase lunch from the canteen up until 12:35pm prior to their departure should they wish.

Uniform

With the weather expected to continue to be hot up until the end of term we have taken the decision to move to PE kit for the remainder of the term.

The full Noel-Baker Academy PE kits consists of:

- Navy blue academy PE t-shirt or plain navy blue t-shirt
- Black or navy **non branded** shorts (not cycling), jogging bottoms or Skort
- Trainers



These items are compulsory. The following items are also acceptable if necessary depending on the weather. These items are not instead of the full PE kit listed above, but over and above should your child require them:

- Noel Baker Academy hooded top. <u>No other hooded top should be worn and a long sleeved T Shirt can be worn under the T Shirt if required.</u>
- A suitable coat or jacket can be worn to school as normal as long as this is removed inside buildings.
- Sun hat

PE Uniform for 2022-23

- As a result of staff, student and parent feedback we will be maintaining our current uniform policy in the new academic year. This means that on days when students have a PE lesson they will continue to come to school in their PE kit. Please note that no PE lessons will take place on students' first day back in September and as such, they will need to be in full uniform.
- The uniform expectations for PE kit will remain the same no branded joggers or shorts will be permitted.

Free Service to Buy and Sell Used School Uniform

We have been made aware of a service that parents may wish to use called "Grown out of It" which can be found at https://www.grownoutofit.co.uk/

This is a website where parents can buy and sell used uniform without being charged. There is a page specifically for Noel-Baker. The service is not linked to school in any way, and we are not responsible for how it performs, but we thought many parents might want to make use of a cost effective and environmentally sustainable alternative to buying new uniform.

Celebration of Culture and Diversity

Between the 11th – 22nd July, we are holding our first Celebration of Culture and Diversity. This celebration will see us learning about different cultures and identities across the world within lessons as well as through a range of cultural experiences including food, music, costume making workshops and much more.

The celebration culminates in a parade where students, staff, governors, and external visitors will join together to recognise and celebrate all members of our diverse school community. It will be a bright, colourful and vibrant start to our sports day this year on Thursday 21st July.

Sports Day

Sports day will be held on Thursday 21st July.

<u>All</u> students are required to attend in their full Noel-Baker Academy PE kit for the duration of the day to allow them to participate. (please see above for details).

Face paints/glitter can we worn on Sports day but in line with our risk assessment, *must* be applied at home and not brought onto school site.



If a student is injured and cannot take a practical part in the activities, they are still required to attend school in their **full PE kit.** Students to be excused from activities must bring a note outlining the details of why they cannot take part. This note must be given to their tutor during morning roll call.

All students should bring a bottle of water to school for sports day that can be re-filled by kitchen staff during lunch if needed.

Attendance

The Attendance Team want to thank those of you who have ensured that your child attended school promptly every day. Your support for their education is invaluable and the benefits they gain from being at school every day cannot be underestimated. The school works incredibly hard to support those of you who struggle with attendance. The recent Ofsted report commented that overall levels of attendance have improved at Noel-Baker Academy, but it remains one of our top priorities. Our pastoral team work with individual pupils closely on this, also involving teachers, and many interventions and incentives have been developed and introduced to tackle barriers to learning - this work will continue to be developed so that all pupils attend well next academic year. Guidelines make it very clear the irreparable damage absence from school has on a child's life chances: If a child's attendance falls below the 90% guideline for persistent absence then this equates to 20 days absence from school, which potentially is 100 lessons missed and the equivalent of one academic year of English, maths or Science lessons. Parents may not be aware of the cumulative effect of the absence. When your child returns in September, within the first few days, their attendance record will be 100%- this needs to be sustained and we will continue to work together effectively to make this happen.
